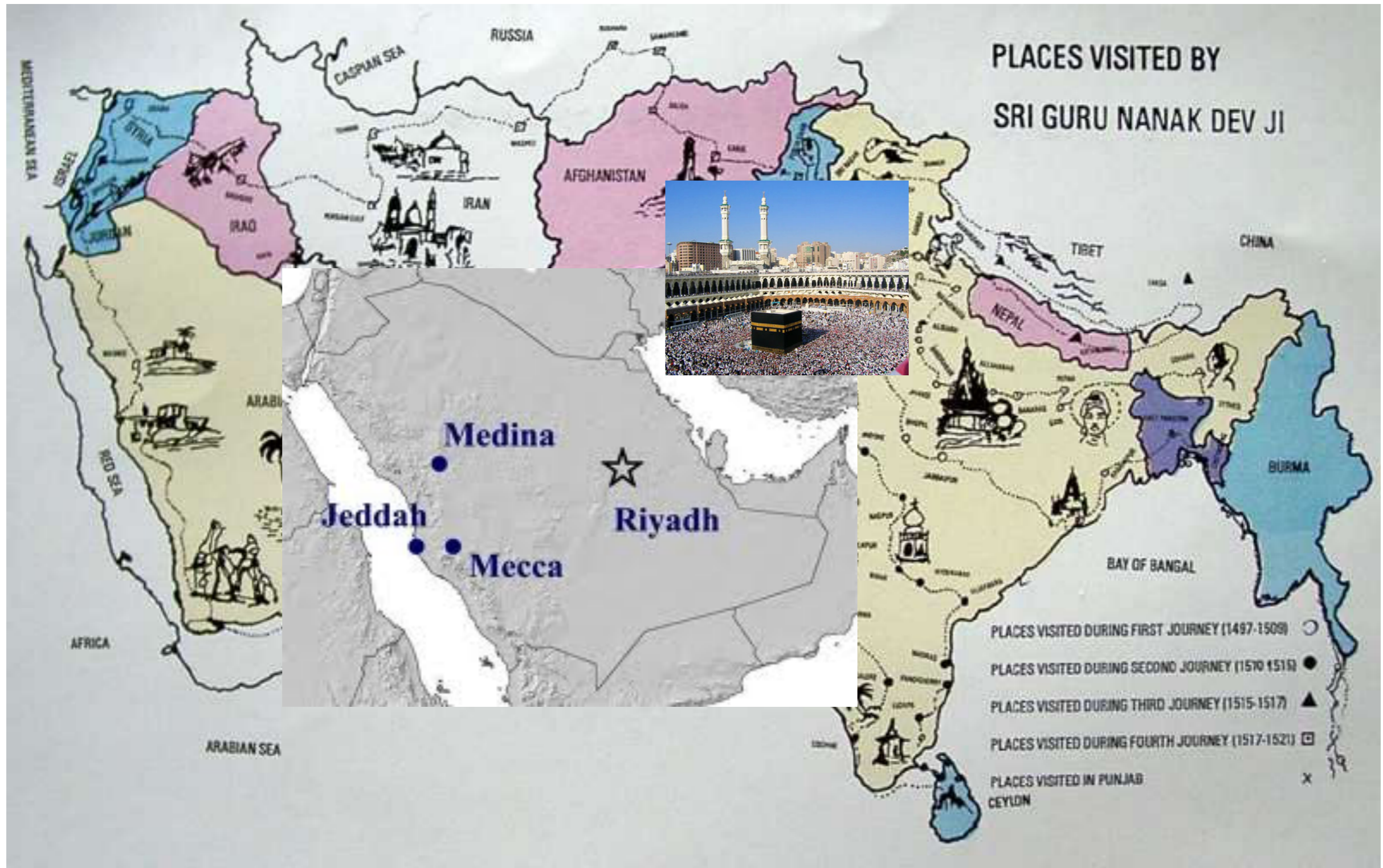

Sri Satguru Nanak Dev Ji's Visit to Mecca



Why shouldn't we wear Blue or Black?



Spreading the word of God, Satguru Nanak Dev Ji entered Mecca dressed in a blue gown as demanded by the muslims. Guru Nanak Dev Ji later wrote:

“Neel Bastar lai kaprey pahirey, Turk - pathani amal kiya”
(I have worn the Blue Gown to adopt the Muslim attire).



Sri Satguru Gobind Singh Ji

writes in his **Zafarnama ਜ਼ਫ਼ਰਨਾਮਾ**: (*meaning the "Declaration of Victory" and is the name given to the letter sent by Guru Gobind Singh Ji in 1705 to the Emperor of India, Aurangzeb.*)



"Barange Magas Sayah posh Aam dand'
("your black attired army attacked me like flies").

The colour black was associated with the enemy.



Sri Satguru Gobind Singh Ji

After the betrayal of Nawab Kapura Brar at Kotkapura, Satguru Ji had to swiftly leave Kotkapura without being detected. At the request of his Sikhs, Satguru Ji reluctantly agreed to dress in a Blue Gown to disguise himself and head out to the village of Dhilwan Sodhian.

Here, on arrival Kaul Sodhi (a descendant of Prithi Chand), presented Guru Gobind Singh Ji with new white clothes. Satguru Ji took off the blue gown and threw it into the fire. As the blue gown burnt in the flames, Satguru Ji said...

"Nil bastar le kapre phare; Turk Pathani amal gaya" (I have torn the blue clothes which I wore, and with that the rule of the Turks and Pathans is at an end").
